LEGAL ADVICE AND INFORMATION

There is a new website set up by the government www.sortingoutseparation.org.uk which has comprehensive information about many areas including legal issues.
The government website www.gov.uk also has a great deal of information relating to divorce and separation, and you can work your way through the process, it also has information about court fees and downloadable forms etc.
Since April 2013 Legal Aid has not generally been available in family cases, however if you would have been eligible for legal aid you can access a telephone legal advice service **Legal Advice Helpline** on 0845 345 4345 (you will be assessed for Legal Aid).
Resolution is an organisation of family lawyers that helps families reach solutions in a non-confrontational way. Their website www.resolution.org.uk can provide information about all aspects of family law and lists local family lawyers who are members.

MAKING A COURT APPLICATION

Local family courts are in **Doncaster/Sheffield/Rotherham/Barnsley**. Helpful leaflets from HM Courts Service **Guide for Separated Parents: Children and the Family Courts (CB7)** and **Making an Application – Children and the Family Courts (CB1)** can be obtained from court offices or online at www.justice.gov.uk/about/hmcts.
Court Fees for making an application are currently £215.00 (as of June 2013). A system known as the remission system is in place for those on a low income who would struggle to pay the fee and the meet the appropriate criteria.
